Please note, not all ENERGY STAR qualified products qualify for a tax credit. ENERGY STAR distinguishes energy efficient products which, although they may cost more to purchase than standard models, will pay you back in lower energy bills within a reasonable amount of time, without a tax credit.

What is included in the Tax Credit?

Tax Credit: 30% of cost up to \$1,500

Expires: December 31, 2010

Details: Must be an existing home & your principal residence. New construction and rentals do

not qualify.

Tax Credit: 30% of cost with no upper limit

Expires: December 31, 2016

Details: Existing homes & new construction qualify. Both principal residences and second

homes qualify. Rentals do not qualify.

- -Geothermal Heat Pumps
- -Small Wind Turbines (Residential)
- -Solar Energy Systems

Tax Credit: Credit Details: 30% of the cost, up to \$500 per .5 kW of power capacity

Expires: December 31, 2016

Details: Existing homes & new construction qualify. Must be your principal residence. Rentals

and second homes do not qualify.

-Fuel Cells (Residential Fuel Cell & Microturbine System)
